- **You can be the transitional generation**
- **The lesson of the Shema: Discipleship begins at home**

*<sup>4</sup>Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. <sup>5</sup>Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. <sup>6</sup>These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. <sup>7</sup>Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. <sup>8</sup>Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. <sup>9</sup>Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates. (Deuteronomy 6:4-9 (NIV))*

- **The Shema teaches us three key issues on generation to generation**

1. Loyalty and fidelity to God
2. Transmission of faith and love comes from home
3. How to keep a constant mindfulness of the teaching and presence of God

- **Teaching morals and values begins at home**
- **Leadership and setting the pace begins at home**

1. Lead with integrity
2. Lead with margin
3. Lead with the eternal perspective
