I. Introduction

- A. James 3:2 (NAS) For we all stumble in many ways. If anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able to bridle the whole body as well.
 - 1. "Perfect" - "complete, mature"

II. Why Should We Tame Our Tongue?

- A. Because my tongue <u>directs</u> where I go.
 - 1. James 3:2-3 (NAS) ²For we all stumble in many ways. If anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able to bridle the whole body as well. ³Now if we put the bits into the horses' mouths so that they will obey us, we direct their entire body as well.
 - 2. James 3:4 (NAS) Look at the ships also, though they are so great and are driven by strong winds, are still directed by a very small rudder wherever the inclination of the pilot desires.
- B. Because my tongue can destroy what I have.
 - 1. James 3:5 (NAS) So also the tongue is a small part of the body, and yet it boasts of great things. See how great a forest is set aflame by such a small fire!
 - 2. James 3:6 (NAS) And the tongue is a fire, the very world of iniquity; the tongue is set among our members as that which defiles the entire body, and sets on fire the course of our life, and is set on fire by hell.
 - 3. Proverbs 21:23 (NAS)
 - 4. James 3:7-8 (NAS) ⁷For every species of beasts and birds, of reptiles and creatures of the sea, is tamed and has been tamed by the human race. ⁸But no one can tame the tongue; it is a restless evil and full of deadly poison.
- C. Because my tongue reveals my true <u>character</u>.
 - 1. James 3:9-10 (NAS) ⁹With it we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in the likeness of God; ¹⁰from the same mouth come both blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not to be this way.
 - 2. James 3:11-12 (NAS) ¹¹Does a fountain send out from the same opening both fresh and bitter water? ¹²Can a fig tree, my brethren, produce olives, or a vine produce figs? Nor can salt water produce fresh.

- A. Get a <u>new heart</u>.

 - 1. James 1:19 (NAS) Everyone must be quick to hear, slow to speak and slow to anger.
