II. The Persecuted Church

- A. Acts 4:1-7 (NAS) ¹As they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple guard and the Sadducees came up to them, ²being greatly disturbed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. ³And they laid hands on them and put them in jail until the next day, for it was already evening. ⁴But many of those who had heard the message believed; and the number of the men came to be about five thousand. ⁵On the next day, their rulers and elders and scribes were gathered together in Jerusalem; ⁶and Annas the high priest was there, and Caiaphas and John and Alexander, and all who were of high-priestly descent. ⁷When they had placed them in the center, they began to inquire, "By what power, or in what name, have you done this?"
 - The Kingdom of God advances not only by the Words of Jesus - and not only by the works of Jesus but also through the wounds of Jesus!
- B. John 15:18-20 (NAS)
 - 1. Persecution is a <u>normal</u> Christian experience, so let's be <u>ready</u> for it!

 - 4. Persecution often comes from people closest to us.
- C. Acts 4:8-13 (NAS) ⁸Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers and elders of the people, ⁹if we are on trial today for a benefit done to a sick man, as to how this man has been made well, ¹⁰let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead—by this name this man stands here before you in good health. ¹¹He is the stone which was rejected by you, the builders, but which became the chief corner stone. ¹²And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved." ¹³Now as they observed the confidence of Peter and John and understood that they were uneducated and untrained men, they were amazed, and began to recognize them as having been with Jesus.
 - 1. Persecution unleashes the Holy Spirit, so let us boldly proclaim the Name of Jesus!
- D. Acts 4:31 (NAS) And when they had prayed, the place where they had gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak the word of God with boldness.
- E. Acts 4:8 (NAS) Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers and elders of the people."
 - 1. "What if I'm not experiencing any persecution for being a follower of Jesus?"

- F. Acts 4:29-30 (NAS) ²⁹"And now, Lord, take note of their threats, and grant that Your bond-servants may speak Your word with all confidence, ³⁰while You extend Your hand to heal, and signs and wonders take place through the name of Your holy servant Jesus."
- G. Acts 4:31 (NAS) And when they had prayed, the place where they had gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak the word of God with boldness.
- H. Acts 4:19-20 (NAS) ¹⁹But Peter and John answered and said to them, "Whether it is right in the sight of God to give heed to you rather than to God, you be the judge; ²⁰for we cannot stop speaking about what we have seen and heard."
- I. Acts 4:13 (NAS) Now as they observed the confidence of Peter and John and understood that they were uneducated and untrained men, they were amazed, and began to recognize them as having been with Jesus.
