I. Introduction

- A. "Enough" ends up being this very elusive amount!
- B. Luke 19:1-2 (NAS) ¹He entered Jericho and was passing through. ²And there was a man called by the name of Zaccheus; he was a chief tax collector and he was rich.
- C. Luke 19:3-4 (NAS) ³Zaccheus was trying to see who Jesus was, and was unable because of the crowd, for he was small in stature. ⁴So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree in order to see Him, for He was about to pass through that way.
- D. Luke 19:5 (NAS) When Jesus came to the place, He looked up and said to him, "Zaccheus, hurry and come down, for today I must stay at your house."
- E. Jesus loves to bring grace to anybody who will open themselves up to Him.
- F. Luke 19:6-7 (NAS) ⁶And he hurried and came down and received Him gladly. ⁷When they saw it, they all began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to be the guest of a man who is a sinner."
1. "Zaccheus, how many camels is it going to take for you to be happy?"
 2. "Zaccheus, how big does your house have to be before you are happy?"
- G. Luke 19:8 (NAS) Zaccheus stopped and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, half of my possessions I will give to the poor, and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will give back four times as much."
- H. Luke 19:9 (NAS) And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he, too, is a son of Abraham."
- I. For Zaccheus, that word "salvation" meant that the disease of "more" that has been corroding his soul, is being healed.
- J. "Enough" is not a level of wealth you achieve; it's a statement of trust you declare.
- K. "Am I going to believe that God is enough? Or, am I going to believe that only when I have more, it will be enough?"
- L. Will you say "enough" like Zaccheus did?
- M. Psalm 24:1 (NAS) The earth is the LORD'S, and all it contains, the world, and those who dwell in it.
