- A. The Lesson of the Birds
 - 1. Matthew 6:25-27 (NLT) ²⁵"That is why I tell you not to worry about everyday life—whether you have enough food and drink, or enough clothes to wear. Isn't life more than food, and your body more than clothing? ²⁶Look at the birds. They don't plant or harvest or store food in barns, for your heavenly Father feeds them. And aren't you far more valuable to him than they are? ²⁷Can all your worries add a single moment to your life?"
 - 2. "Stop living as if there's <u>nobody</u> looking out for you. Because the truth is, <u>Someone</u> is looking out for you!"
 - 3. Matthew 10:29 (NLT) "What is the price of two sparrows—one copper coin? But not a single sparrow can fall to the ground without your Father knowing it."
 - 4. Matthew 10:31 (NLT) "So don't be afraid; you are more valuable to God than a whole flock of sparrows."
- B. The Lesson of the **Dust**

- 1. Psalm 103:12-14 (NLT) ¹²He has removed our sins as far from us as the east is from the west. ¹³The LORD is like a father to his children, tender and compassionate to those who fear him. ¹⁴For he knows how weak we are; he remembers we are only dust.
- 2. You are not perfect!
- 3. God knows I'm not perfect. God knows all about me, and He <u>loves</u> <u>me</u> and forgives me anyway!

C. The Lesson of the <u>Grass</u>

- 1. Psalm 90:5-6 (NLT) ⁵You sweep people away like dreams that disappear. They are like grass that springs up in the morning. ⁶In the morning it blooms and flourishes, but by evening it is dry and withered.
- 2. Life is unspeakably <u>precious</u>. And <u>time</u> is unbelievably short.
- 3. You can only live <u>one square</u> at a time.
